With their performances in a trance state of consciousness, the musicians and sound-energy therapists of the Vedun Ensemble bestow upon their listeners the harmonising therapeutic sounds of the moment. They follow in the footsteps of the ancient Veduns who were Slavic priests, healers, and musicians of the past. Their own spontaneous, unrepeatable (channelled) sounds and music are rooted in the melos and musical practices of the ancient Slovenes, of European and Slavic nations, and of different cultures of the world. This ranges from throat singing to transcendent performances which were at one time highly esteemed. Their unique sound yarn weaves folk songs of past eras with unique and almost forgotten musical instruments of different cultures (each performance featuring between 50 and 100 or so). All the musicians are multi-instrumentalists and singers. Their sound fabric, crafted from the jewels of the world's musical heritage, is strongly harmonising; it expands consciousness and awareness, reaching into the depths of spirit and heart. Vedun concerts are special and are globally rare. They are a unique experience. The content of a concert by the Vedun (formerly Trutamora Slovenica) Ensemble is based on more than 50 years of research into the Slovene and world's musical and spiritual heritages, carried out by Mira Omerzel - Mirit, Ph.D., who is the global instigator of ethnoarchaeo-medical/vibrational musicology. Besides a musical education, the most precious training for contemporary Veduns has been the combination of learning in Mirit's spiritual-therapeutic Veduna School and travelling across the world, meeting and collaborating with the keepers of musical traditions of different cultures on all continents. The Vedun Ensemble connects art, science, the folk tradition, and the world's spiritual wisdom. It brings back to ancient music its enchanting, magical, revered, and harmonising tones – from the past and for the future. For peace in the world.



CONCERT PROGRAMME AND INSTRUMENTS

- 1. **ANCIENT SLOVENIA** singing saw, drone and guitar zithers, cimbalom, jaw harp, clay whistle, plonarca (concertina), Slovene multi-part singing, spontaneous singing
- 2. **CELTIC-SLAVIC SOUNDS AND ANCIENT EUROPEAN SOUNDS** 'animal talk', pagan harp, old fiddle and gusle, jaw harps, flutes, panpipes, ceremonial drums, tender singing and throat singing (joik), Renaissance lute and bowed psaltery, stringed drum
- 3. **SIBERIA AND MONGOLIA** ancient igil and gusle, dangubica tambouras, Siberian chartan, shamanic drums, jaw harps, throat singing khoomei, spontaneous singing
- 4. **SLAVS WITHIN THE GEORGIAN, RUSSIAN, AND UKRAINIAN MELOS** balalaikas, 'tiger' dombra, bullroarers, tender multi-part throat singing
- 5. **INDIA** GAYATRI MANTRA, tampura, bansuri flutes, santoor, sarangi, hansa veena, sarod, bells, tincu cymbal, Vedic singing
- 6. **SLAVS OF THE BALKANS** kemenche, gusle, saz, kaval, female tamboura, duduk, ljirica, frula, daf, shargia, small and large tapan drums, tender singing and throat singing
- 7. **THE MIDDLE EAST AND ARABIA** setar, kamaicha, saz, daf, duduk, dambora, oud, microtonal singing
- 8. **AFRICAN MELOS** kora, udu, sansas, hang, voice

- 9. **INDIGENOUS PEOPLES OF NORTH AND SOUTH AMERICA** double flute, quena, charangos, reed pipes, drums
- 10. HAWAIIAN MELOS ukulele, rainstick, Hawaiian guitars, bird sounds
- 11. **CHINESE MELOS AND BALINESE HARMONIES** pipa, Vietnamese flute, clay flute xun, bamboo flute xiao, guqin, gongs; Balinese gamelan/suling flutes, bells, brass komplrs, bamboo rindik
- 12. TIBET gyuto monk throat singing, Tibetan horn, conch, large gong, tincu cymbal, Himalayan bowl
- 13. **GRECO-BALKAN AND GYPSY MELOS** bouzouki, dafs, multi-part singing, handbells
- 14. **CRYSTAL (THERAPEUTIC) SOUNDS AND INSTRUMENTS OF THE WORLD** crystal harp, crystal bowl, singing saw, Balinese bells, kora, ukulele, Hawaiian guitars, bansuri flutes, sarangi, hansa veena, kamaicha, kemenche, spontaneous voices, santoor, taus, rhubab
